Brian Mortillaro with LMP presented the Board with a proposal to fill in some of the empty areas along the wall. Supervisor Uhlig said she thought they would just do bushes because it would be

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cheaper. She also asked if the plantings in the proposal would be frost-tolerant, and Mr. Mortillaro said yes. Mr. Woods asked what types of plants were being suggested. Mr. Mortillaro went over what would do well in the area. Supervisor Uhlig asked about using wax myrtle trees. Mr. Mortillaro said they were trying to get rid of those types of trees. Mr. Woods said they don't really produce persistent color. Supervisor Cruz said this may be a good opportunity to take care of the area once and for all, and they want color.

Supervisor Uhlig asked when they had started keeping track of the types of plants installed. Mr. Mortillaro said in the summer. Supervisor Cruz asked what happened with this rotation. Mr. Woods said he would suggest aligning plantings with the nurseries, and February is early for the spring rotation. The winter rotation should be November through February, and the spring rotation should start in March. Mr. Woods provided the traditional color schemes and what is available. Supervisor Cruz said using that schedule, there would be about six weeks left in this rotation, and there are about 40% of the annuals dead. She asked if they should be replaced. Mr. Woods said they should have the contractor replace them under warranty.

Mr. Woods said that in March, they would go with the bouquet look with spring mix, as these handle the increasing heat. Supervisor Cruz talked about the flowers at a shopping center off of Dale Mabry in Carrollwood. She asked for Mr. Woods to stop by and take a look. Supervisor Cruz also talked about zero scape landscaping. Mr. Mortillaro said will bring annual suggestions for next month and will replace the flowers that failed due to irrigation.

Mr. Mortillaro brought up the proposal to remove the three dead pines. The Board discussed the proposal. Ms. Hicks said they shouldn't wait because they will lose more trees.

B. Discussion on Boulders

Ms. Hicks gave brief update on what occurred with the boulders and that the CDD received a violation from the County because the boulders are in violation of the clear zone. Mr. Babbar said that with the current agreement with the County, the CDD is permitted to do certain landscaping improvements, but the area belongs to the county. Supervisor Cruz said the County hasn't maintained the area. Mr. Babbar said adverse possession doesn't apply to government property. Supervisor Kilpatrick said they do not want to expose the CDD to any liability. She said they should ask the County to provide the CDD with alternatives to stop speeding and prevent people from damaging the landscaping. Then, the CDD can move the boulders. Mr. Babbar said if they don't move the boulders, the County can take away the CDD's right to maintain the area and expose the CDD to liability.

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The Board discussed sending a letter to the County expressing the issues and their concerns. Mr. Babbar said that his concern with drafting a letter on District Counsel's letterhead is that it may cause an escalation in the situation. The Board discussed and agreed that Counsel can write the letter and send to management for Board approval. Management will use the CDD's letterhead and send it to the County.

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Mr. Babbar said his only other update is that he is monitoring the legislative cycle and will provide updates as necessary.

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Ms. Hicks said it was a clean audit, and the District is in good financial standing. Supervisor Kilpatrick asked about the depreciation and report of investments.
