The Regular Meeting of the Board of Supervisors for Northwood Community Development District was held on **Monday**, **June 10**, **2019 at 6:30 p.m.**, at the Northwood Clubhouse located at 27248 Big Sur Drive, Wesley Chapel, Florida 33544.

1. CALL TO ORDER

Nicole Hicks called the Regular Meeting of the Board of Supervisors of the Northwood Community Development District to order on **Monday**, **June 10**, **2019 at 6:32 p.m.**

2. AUDIENCE QUESTIONS AND COMMENTS ON AGENDA ITEMS

A. Discussion with Pasco County

Sherman Applegate with Pasco County Utilities provided an overview of the project and said it is still on same schedule. If everything goes according to plan, the project should be completed beginning of September. They reached out to the engineering department to see about alternate closures, but they cannot keep making changes. Supervisor Kilpatrick said everyone thinks safety is the most important thing, especially the safety of the children. She said a meeting could have been held before changing the road closure to discuss it and let everyone know what was going on. Supervisor Kilpatrick said she thinks they could close the road off at one entrance. Residents could go in and out from the other entrance, and the community would not be divided. She thinks the Board should have been part of the decision.

Supervisor Cruz said they have divided the community in half. She asked if they thought of

49 emergency vehicles, the post office, and waste management. Mike Bunk with Pasco County

- 50 Utilities said yes, they considered all of that and contacted the school board. Supervisor Cruz asked
- if they were aware that all of the kids were dropped off by the bus at Racetrack, regardless of age.
- Mr. Bunk said that was a school board decision, and they have no control over that. Supervisor
- Kilpatrick stated that school reopens before the work will be finished. She wanted to know if Pasco
- County Utilities can communicate with the school board to let them know about closure. Mr. Bunk
- said they can, but they cannot dictate their bus routes. Supervisor Quigley asked if parents should
- reach out to the school. Mr. Bunk said yes, they should contact the school if they are concerned.
- 57 Supervisor Cruz asked if the post office had been contacted. Pasco County Utilities aid yes, the post
- office was contacted and that road closures happen all the time.

Supervisor Cruz said that boulders were put on a property owners. Mr. Applegate said that was approved by the property owner, and if there is any damage, the County will repair it. Supervisor Cruz said this is a collector road and wanted to know if damage is due to traffic. Mr. Applegate said no, the damage is due to a failed pipe. Supervisor Kilpatrick said they want the community open in the middle and would like to have the entrance at Highway 56 closed off and just have the entrance at County Line Road open. Mr. Applegate asked if they know the percentage of residents that are for this change, or if not, if a survey can be done. The Board said there are always going to be people that are unhappy, but they think this most people would approve of this change.

Supervisor Quigley asked how much of the road they are going to repair; the answer was that any part of the road that is getting fixed will be repaved. Supervisor Uhlig asked if the road will collapse. Mr. Applegate said that it already has in some places. There was some discussion on people moving barricades at closed off areas to drive through. Mr. Applegate said to call the police if someone is seen doing that.

Mr. Bunk said the truck traffic study has been completed, and they will restrict the truck traffic in the community for no through-traffic for commercial trucks. Only commercial trucks that have business in the community will be allowed. Supervisor Uhlig asked if when this happens they can have more deputy coverage. Mr. Bunk suggested attending the next County Commissioner board meeting on July 9th. The sign that is installed will be the symbol letting trucks know they are not allowed. Supervisor Cruz asked if the signs can be installed before the road is reopened.

B. Resident Comments

Residents asked why the County is looking to close off the entrance at Highway 56 instead of County Line Road. Mr. Applegate said that emergency services come from County Line Road.

A resident wanted know what can be done to expedite the work. The answer was that they are working as fast as they can, but it is tedious work. They want to be successful without having to dig up the road completely.

Residents wanted to know if the work is costing the community anything, and the answer is no, the County is paying for it. They also asked when the work is being done, and the County said that it is being completed in 12-hour shifts on weekdays.

Residents asked if the community can be gated. Supervisor Uhlig said that would require a special 95 assessment to the residents. 96 97 A resident said she thought it was disrespectful how the project was done. She said that Northwood 98 is a large community, and one or two people should not have made the decision. Closing off the 56 99 entrance will be very inconvenient to the residents. 100 101 Residents wanted to know where the work is being done. The County said the work will be from the 102 manhole where the pipe starts to the manhole where the pipe ends. 103 104 Residents commented that the County should not close the 56 entrance because they have seen 105 emergency vehicles coming in from that entrance as well, and it will also cause an issue with summer 106 school busses. 107 108 C. Discussion with Pasco County Sheriff's Office 109 110 Captain Tait Sanborn with the Pasco County Sheriff's Office said that they are receiving a lot of calls 111 from residents with different opinions and concerns. They will do their best to enforce whatever is 112 113 decided. 114 There was some discussion on people parking in the middle of the street to stop speeding. Mr. Sanborn 115 said he understands the community concerns, but this is a big risk if emergency vehicles cannot get 116 through. There was also some discussion on off-duty deputy duties. 117 118 There was a question about if there was a mandatory evacuation and the road is closed. Mr. Sanborn 119 said in that case, the Sheriff's Office would work to move barricades. 120 121 Supervisor Quigley asked if they can encourage tickets being given out for things like street parking. 122 Mr. Sanborn said the sheriffs would be looking for habitual nature. There was some discussion on 123 speeding. Supervisor Cruz said she thinks there should be two warnings given and then a citation. 124 125 Supervisor Medina asked if emergency vehicles were actually notified because he was almost hit by 126 one trying to get by. Mr. Applegate said, yes they were notified. 127 128 Mr. Applegate stated that the County would like a letter from the CDD about the change in the road 129 closure they are requesting. 130 131 132 133 3.
